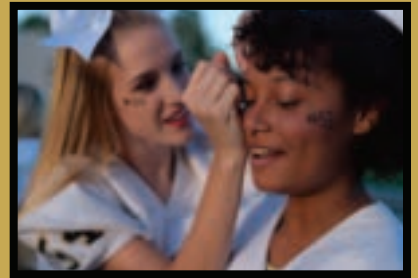

2019 FIDELIS AWARD

Maur Hill-Mount Academy and The League of St. Maur honored Mick '84 and Geri '86 Harris as this year's Fidelis Award recipients.

The Harris' are legacies of Maur Hill Prep and Mount St. Scholastica Academy. Mick's father, Mike Harris '62, and his mother, Caroline Harris '63, graduated from these Benedictine schools as well as Mick's two sisters and brother. Geri's mother, Dorothy Pickman '54, graduated from Mount St. Scholastica Academy, as well as all four of Geri's sisters. Mick was born in California but raised in Atchison. After graduating from Maur-Hill Prep, he attended the University of Kansas graduating with a BS in Business Administration in 1988. Mick is the President and Managing Director of McCormick Distilling Co. Inc. He started as a Sales Representative at the company in 1991.

Geri, an Atchison native, worked at Runyan Jewelers full-time as a sales associate from 1989 to 1995. She then worked at Atchison Leather Products for one year until becoming a stay-at-home mom full-time. She returned to work at Runyan Jewelers part time until they closed their doors in 2014.

The Fidelis Award, meaning "faithful", was created in 1991 by the Board of Directors of Mount St. Scholastica Academy to recognize selected alumnae, benefactors, and friends who have contributed significantly. The criteria established by the Board require that the honoree give outstanding personal service or outstanding financial service to the school in the Spirit of Christ.

Mick and Geri were married at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Atchison in June 1993. When it was time for their own children to attend high school, there was no question as to where Mick and Geri would send them. Allie, '14, Drew '15, and Cole '18 graduated from Maur Hill-Mount Academy.

Over the years, Mick and Geri have been extremely generous with their time and commitment to Maur Hill-Mount Academy. Mick served on the Board of Directors at Maur Hill-Mount Academy from 2009 to 2016, serving as Chairman of the Board from 2013 to 2015. Geri has volunteered in several roles at the school throughout the years, some of which include: the League of St. Maur dinner and silent auction, prom fundraisers, After-Prom, and as a parent contact for various sports.

"Maur Hill and the Mount were important parts of growing up in Atchison for us. The people, priests, brothers, sisters, teachers, coaches, and staff who comprise the school, had a very positive impact on our lives and who we would become." Mick said. "We feel it is important to do what we can to help ensure that the school continues as a vibrant part of the community for future generations."

"Mick and Geri's commitment to MH-MA over the years made them an obvious candidate for this prestigious award," said MH-MA President Phil Baniewicz. "Many people don't know this, but Mick is one of the key people responsible for turning this school around. His leadership and vision helped revitalize the school we are today. 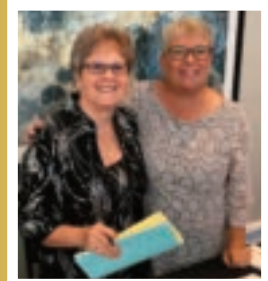

ALUMNI OF THE YEAR AWARD

In September, Mick Hundley '02 was awarded Alumni of the Year at the League of St. Maur Dinner in Kansas City.

Mick, a native of Atchison, Kan., attended Kansas State University his freshman year and then transferred to the University of Missouri. At Mizou, he worked as a student assistant coach for the Tigers football program from 2003-2006. He received his bachelor's degree from the University of Missouri in Dec. 2006.

Established by the Association in 2014, this prestigious honor recognizes an alumnus/alumna who exemplifies the true passion and commitment of what being a proud alumni is all about. The award is presented in appreciation and recognition of outstanding achievement, contribution, and service to all things Maur Hill - Mount Academy.

After college, Mick returned to his roots and accepted the position of Development Director at Maur Hill-Mount Academy, where he worked from 2007-2010. During his time at MH-MA, he focused on building relationships with alumni across the globe. His fundraising efforts emphasized building a successful Penning Science Wing renovation campaign, raising over \$500,000. While at MH-MA, Mick also was an assistant coach for the Ravens football team.

Mick has served in key leadership positions on many boards and committees for MH-MA and the Atchison community. His commitment to his high school alma mater has always been strong in force, serving as past President of the MH-MA Alumni Association Board and past Vice President of the MH-MA 500 Club.



“Mick’s ongoing service to MH-MA made him a slam dunk choice for the Alumni of the Year award,” said Alumni President Ted Henry. “He’s truly a presence on campus and at alumni gatherings, and we’re honored and lucky that he’s chosen to give so much of himself to the school.”

2018-2019 Men's Basketball League and Sub-State Champions

The 2018-2019 boys basketball team went undefeated in the regular season, winning both league and sub-state titles. Their season came up short, losing to Thomas More Prep-Marian in the first round of the state tournament.

KS Football Coaches name Caudle and Siebenmorgen among Kansas' Best

Seniors Jack Caudle and Abe Siebenmorgen led the MH-MA Ravens to their first League title in 27 years.

QB Jack Caudle (left) #10, finished the 2019 season 120/183 in passing for 1903 yards, 27 touchdowns/6 interceptions. He averaged 262.5 yards per game.

Linebacker and tight-end Siebenmorgen (right) #11, finished the season with 114 tackles and 3 sacks. As tight-end he caught 23 passes for 296 yards and 7 TD's.

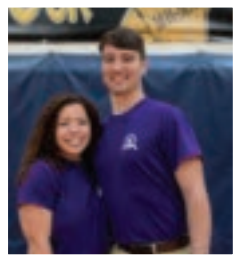

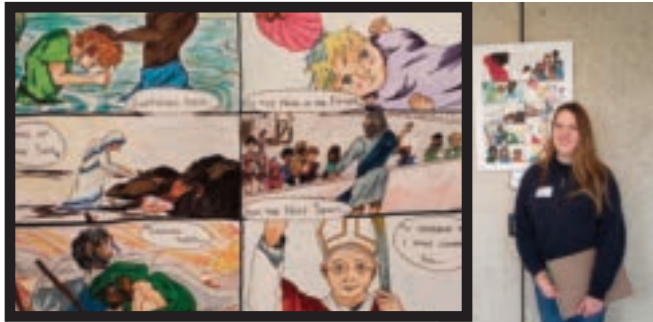

Class of 2019 Reigns in Excellence

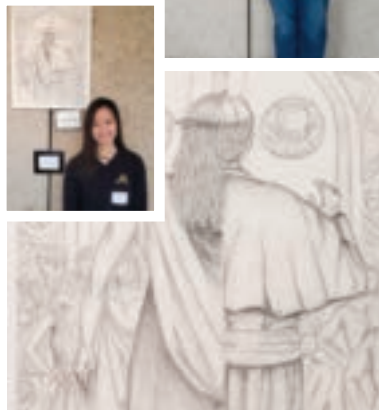

ST. MICHAEL'S HALL MH-MA CAFETERIA



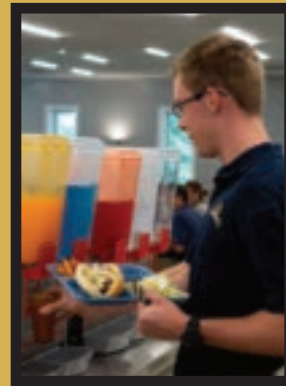
The layout of the MH-MA's newly renovated cafeteria was designed to accommodate larger groups of people. The 2019 Homecoming reception was held in the new space in September.

ST. MICHAEL'S HALL RENOVATED THANKS TO ALUMNI

There is now a beverage station offering several choices to the students including juices, coffee and tea. There is a state-of-the-art salad station and a new area for returning food trays.

As with any renovations and improvements at the school, it takes time and money to make these changes. Praise God, there were several people in the community who wanted to see this renovation come to fruition.

"Several alumni and friends stepped up with material and financial donations to help us see this project through to completion," said Maur Hill-Mount Academy President, Phil Baniewicz. "It was important to finally focus on the cafeteria. It's not there to serve students one meal a day. It's every meal, every day for our boarding students."

Terrazzo flooring donated by 1960 alumnus Arvin DeMarco, and lighting donated by 1969 alumnus Marc Migliazzo, owner of EIS Lighting, are just a few of the major differences in the newly renovated space. Alumnus Clint Pickman '99, employed by DeMarco Brothers Co., oversaw the entire flooring project.

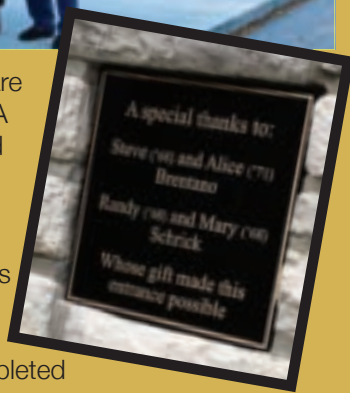

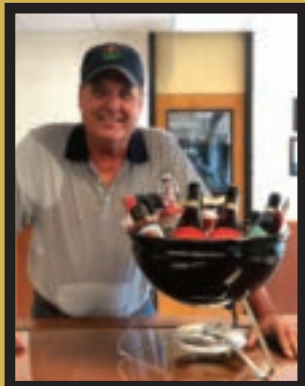

A WELCOMING IMPRESSION

If you happen to drive down Green Street in Atchison you might notice something new at the school. Towering among the trees, is a grand, new entrance that welcomes visitors to Maur Hill-Mount Academy. With the school crest centered on the iron archway and pillars clad in stone, it's pretty hard to miss.

Thanks to donations from 1968 alumni and Atchison residents, Randy and Mary Schrick, along with Steve Brentano, class of 1968, and his wife, Alice, class of 1971, the entrance now makes a strong, prep school statement.

Brentano grew up across the street from the school. The red brick house on the corner is still owned by the Brentano family today.

"There used to be two columns that stood at the entrance to the school," Brentano said. "I used to play and climb on those columns with my friends."

When Brentano came across an old photo of the columns, he showed it to MH-MA President Phil Baniewicz and said he wanted to try to reproduce it. Brentano talked to long-time friend Randy Schrick about his thoughts and they decided to make it happen. And, now the rest is history with one exception. "No one is allowed to climb on it," MH-MA President Baniewicz said.

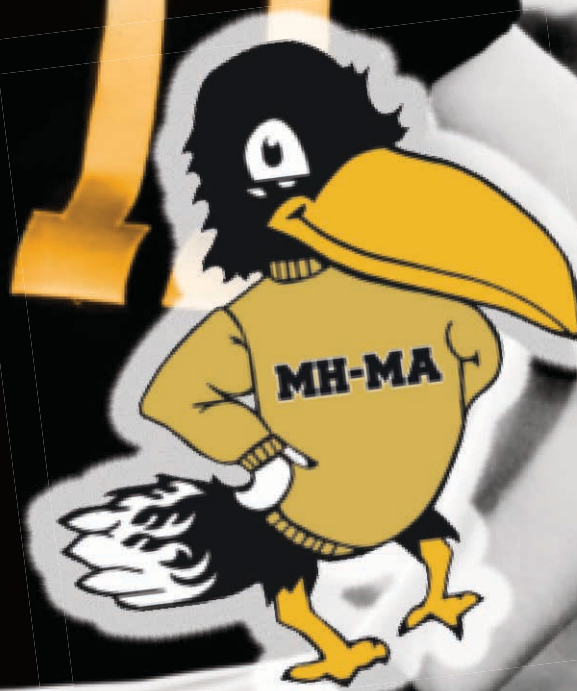
